Mikhail Faerman began studying the piano at the age of three.

He was admitted to the class of Eugenia YARKONEKO at the Central Music School of Moscow from 1962 to 1972.

He then enrolled at the Moscow State Conservatory of Music where he studied in the class of the famous professor, Jacob Flier, with whom he worked between 1972 and 1977.

In 1975, he won First Prize in the Queen Elisabeth Music Competition in Brussels.

In 1978, he was granted permission to leave Russia. He passed through Vienna and finally reached Belgium.

In 1979, he became professor at the Royal Music Conservatory of Mons.

In November 1987, he was a judge for the first European Piano Competition.

Since 1997, he has been a professor at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Brussels.
